## **Project Background:**

Frontline Healthcare Workers Safety Foundation, Ltd. is partnering with the Program for Monitoring Emerging Diseases (ProMED) to engage Iraqis who respond to or investigate biological threats and outbreaks. An online training course on detection, response, and reporting on biological outbreaks of concern will be offered to at least 100 incident responders in Iraq. We will leverage local partnerships at the Biorisk Management Institute of Kurdistan, in the Kurdistan Regional Government (KRG), and within the Central Government of Iraq to identify at least 100 course participants representing law enforcement, emergency responders, nurses, and hospital staff. The course will be available in English and Modern Arabic. The course material will cover response protocols to natural biological outbreaks and weaponized biological attacks including: recognizing signs and symptoms of outbreaks; distinguishing traits of a terrorist attack vs. a natural biological outbreak; creating a decision matrix against terror attacks; reviewing the importance of using and correctly discarding personal protective equipment (PPE); destroying or securing samples after an outbreak; and reporting biological incidents using traditional and non-traditional avenues.

## **Deliverables from Dr. Nabi:**

- Review and approve the course application form.
- Review the beta versions of the English and Arabic-language version of the course.
- Coordinate and manage the process to identify a minimum of 100 approved participants. (There
  is an upper limit of 130 participants). Participants can include a cross sections of first responders.
  Because the course is online, we would like to encourage participants from remote locations,
  where access to training is more difficult.
- \$2000 of the South Invited is being sur-scille for this deliberable assessment assessment. The need not pass it, but they should take the final assessment. During the project, as a team, we will determine how to most effectively spend this money to ensure we achieve this deliverable.
