TYPES OF TOURIST ACCOMMODATION

- **1. A Hotel:** an establishment providing accommodation, meals, and other services for travelers and tourists.
- **2. A Motel:** is a place you can stay overnight, with plenty of parking and easy access to a highway.
- **3. An Apartment:** a room or set of rooms fitted especially with housekeeping facilities and usually rented as a lodging.
- **4. A Cruise ship:** is a large ship which takes people from place to place on a cruise holiday, and on which entertainment, food, and drink are provided.
- **5. A Country house:** is a house and especially a mansion in the country.
- **6. A University Hall of Residence:** a building for university or college students to live in.

TOURIST ACCOMMODATION

- Tourist Accommodation: is one of the sixth sub- sectors of the tourism industry. It can be classified as:
- **1.** <u>Served accommodation</u>: this refers to any sort of accommodation where the guests receive a place to sleep, meals, porter services, reception services, and so on.
- Typical examples of served accommodation are: hotels- motels- guest houses- bed and breakfast.
- 2. <u>Self- catering accommodation:</u> in this sort of accommodation the guests prepare their own meals, and very few other services are provided except for reception.
- Types of self- catering accommodation include: apartments- campsite- caravans- motorhomes- villas.

We use certain prepositions to describe where things and people are. These include at, in, on, between, near (to), and next to.

- at for a building or an address

 Many people stay at our campsite.

 The guesthouse is located at 12 Northumberland

 Avenue.
- in for a specific street, town, or country, and the countryside in general
 The hotel is in Northumberland Avenue.
 I'd prefer to stay somewhere in the countryside.
- on for rivers, the coast, famous streets, and floors of a building I'm staying at a hotel on Fifth Avenue. Our room is on the seventh floor.

Note that both *in* and *at* can be used for buildings. *In* generally refers to a position inside, while *at* suggests the function of the building.

He's at the gym. (= he is doing exercise)
He's in the gym. (= his location is inside the gym)

In, at, and on are used in many other expressions to describe location, which need to be learnt individually, e.g. in the middle, at home, on the top.

Between means in the middle of two things.

The gymnasium is **between** the car park and the swimming pool.

Opposite means on the other side to a person, building, or other object.

My hotel is **opposite** the station. NOT My hotel is opposite to the station.

Near (to) means not very far from something or someone.

I'd prefer to be near (to) the financial district.

Next to means at the side of something or someone. I am standing next to the conference centre.

SERVICES AND FACILITIES

Hotels are the most popular type of accommodation in many countries. They can be small, family-owned hotels, hotels at popular resorts catering for holidaymakers, business hotels, and so on.

All hotels offer a range of services and facilities. In general Services involve a member of the hotel staff doing something for you. Typical services are reception services.

transportation and transfers, tourist information, ticket reservations, laundry, and room service.

 Facilities make the guest's stay more enjoyable, and include restaurants and bars, business centres, sports facilities, minibar, pay TV, internet connection in room, direct dial telephone, and so on.


HOTELS CLASSIFICATION

Depending on the range of services and facilities on offer, a hotel can be classified as 1-star through to 5-star. The star rating system is the classification that is used most around the world. Other systems exist, but all of them essentially classify hotels as luxury, superior, mid-market, and budget / economy.



HOTEL RESERVATIONS

Reservations for hotels can be taken in different ways:

- face-to-face in the hotel
- s by phone
- by email, fax, or in writing using a conventional letter
- through a travel agent
- through the Internet.

Internet bookings are increasingly common and use computer reservation systems like Sabre or Apollo. Major hotel chains usually have their own system. Hotel receptionists are trained to follow strict procedures when entering information about a reservation into the hotel reservation system.


