# Common derivational affixes that cause a change in word class

1- derived nouns

2- derived verbs

3- derived adjectives

4- derived adverbs

### Common Derivational affixes of Nouns (1)

#### Verb to Noun

- arrive+ -al
- attend+ -ance
- transform + -ation
- sing + -er , act + or , beg + ar
- conform + -ist

### Common Derivational affixes of Nouns (2)

#### **Adjective to Noun**

- sick + -ness
- pure + -ity
- feudal + -ism
- free + -dom

### Common Derivational affixes of Nouns (3)

#### **Noun to Noun**

- friend + -ship
- human + -ity
- king + -dom
- store + -age
- America + -n
- library + -arian
- mono- + lingual
- ex- + wife
- auto- + biography

### Common Derivational affixes of Verbs (1)

#### Noun to Verb

- moral + -ize
- vaccine + -ate
- hast + -en
- im- + prison
- be- + friend
- en- + joy
- in- + habit

### Common Derivational affixes of Verbs (2)

**Adjective to Verb** 

- en- + large
- en- + rich

### Common Derivational affixes of Verbs (3)

#### **Verb to Verb**

- un- + do
- re- + cover
- dis- + believe
- auto- + destruct

### Common Derivational affixes of Adjectives (1)

#### Noun to Adjective

- boy + -ish
- virtue + -ous
- affection + -ate
- health + -ful
- alcohol + -ic

### Common Derivational affixes of Adjectives (2)

#### **Verb to Adjective**

- read + -able
- create + -ive
- migrate + -ory
- sun + -y

### Common Derivational affixes of Adjectives (3)

**Adjective to Adjective** 

- pink + -ish
- red + -like
- a- + moral
- il- + legal, in- + accurate, un- + happy, im- + pure, dis- + agreeable
- semi- + annual
- sub- + minimal

### Adverb-forming suffixes

Adj. + -ly:formally, calmly, easily-ward/wards:homeward, afterwards, backwards-wise/ways:clockwise, otherwise, sideways-fold:twofold, threefold

### To sum up (1)

#### Common English derivational affixes that cause a <u>change</u> in word class

Noun to Adjective	-ful (help $\rightarrow$ helpful), -al (recreation $\rightarrow$ recreational), -ish (boy $\rightarrow$ boyish), -ic (alcohol $\rightarrow$ alcoholic)
Verb to Noun	-ance (accept $\rightarrow$ acceptance), -ation (accuse $\rightarrow$ accusation), -er (play $\rightarrow$ player), -ion (predict $\rightarrow$ prediction), -ist (reform $\rightarrow$ reformist)
Adjective to Adverb	-ly (clear $\rightarrow$ clearly; exact $\rightarrow$ exactly)
Noun to Verb	-fy (glory $\rightarrow$ glorify), -ize (moral $\rightarrow$ moralize), -ate (vaccine $\rightarrow$ vaccinate)
Adjective to Noun	-ness (sad $\rightarrow$ sadness), -ity (specific $\rightarrow$ specificity), -ism (feudal $\rightarrow$ feudalism), - dom (free $\rightarrow$ freedom)
Verb to Adjective	-able (drink $\rightarrow$ drinkable), -ive (act $\rightarrow$ active), -ory (migrate $\rightarrow$ migratory)
Adjective to Verb	-ize (modern → modernize, or modernise in British English), -en (dark → darken)

#### To sum up (2)

## Common English derivational affixes that <u>do not</u> cause a change in word class

Noun to Noun	-ship (friend $\rightarrow$ friendship), -ity (human $\rightarrow$ humanity), -dom (king $\rightarrow$ kingdom), dis- (advantage $\rightarrow$ disadvantage), ex- (wife $\rightarrow$ ex-wife), auto- (biography $\rightarrow$ autobiography)
Verb to Verb	un- (do $\rightarrow$ undo), re- (write $\rightarrow$ rewrite), dis- (like $\rightarrow$ dislike), auto- (destruct $\rightarrow$ autodestruct)
Adjective to Adjective	-ish (yellow $\rightarrow$ yellowish), -like (red $\rightarrow$ redlike), a- (moral $\rightarrow$ amoral), il- (legal $\rightarrow$ illegal), in- (expensive $\rightarrow$ inexpensive), un- (happy $\rightarrow$ unhappy), semi- (annual $\rightarrow$ semiannual), dis- (agreeable $\rightarrow$ disagreeable), sub- (conscious $\rightarrow$ subconscious)

#### Derivation without affecting the pronunciation

Suffixes such as -er, -ful, -ish, -less, -ly, and -ness may be tacked onto a base word without affecting the pronunciation, as in:

#### baker, wishful, boyish, needless, and happiness

### Derivation with affecting the pronunciation

Other suffixes such as <u>-y, -ive</u>, and <u>-ize</u> may be tacked onto a base word <u>with</u> affecting the pronunciation, as in:
