11. Assessment Scheme

1. First midterm exam 20% (Listening 5M, Speaking 5M, Reading 5M, and Writing 5M)
2. Second midterm exam 20% (Listening 5M, Speaking 5M, Reading 5M, and Writing 5M)
3. Final exam 60% (Listening 15M, Speaking 15M, Reading 15M, and Writing 15M)
