

# **Gender Studies**

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#### **Course overview:**

This course provides students with an interdisciplinary introduction to the ideas shaped about gender from a range of academic perspectives, including various angls; language, anthropology, sociology, Psychology, politics, Law and social discourses. However, theories and methods used in gender studies, with linking gender issues to social work and dealing with gender issues on ground will be the main focus of this course. Through the examination of a variety of topics, students will explore the ways that gender shapes societies and cultures historically.

The course takes its departure from the existed perspectives on gender and uses critical text analyses as a focus and methodology. Gender Studies course takes a broad variety of theoretical approach to topics of women studies, mean studies, and gay, Lesbian, bisexual, and transgender studies. This class will help students to learn the subjects related to gender and gender inequality and improve their understanding and critical thinking and skills in dealing with gender issues in the field of social work.

- To discuss, with supporting examples, how local, national, and global policies and practices continue to oppress and dominate individuals' lives based on their gender.
- To demonstrate knowledge and skills in the cultural context of gender issues.
