10. Course overview:

This course is intended for the first year students of Arabic Department. It prepares students to study wholly or partly in English medium to join the world of academic English. The text book for studying is *General English for University Students*. This book consists of five themes, covering a wide range of areas of human knowledge in the fields of education, psychology and sociology, work and business, science and nature and, the physical world. Within each

theme there are four main sections, each dealing with a discrete skill: listening, speaking, reading or writing. Furthermore, the course provides students with an understanding of how vocabulary is used in different situations depending on the ways of communicating different skills in university life.

11. Course objective:

By the end of this course, students will be able to understand the main types of academic spoken language, lectures and discussions, and the main types of academic written language, journal articles and encyclopaedia entries. They are expected to speak in English and to produce oral presentations, contributions to tutorial and written assignments. Therefore, it prepares students to know how to find and develop ideas, and to communicate in academic English. The course will lead up students to be more interested in attaining special skills in spoken English language.

12. Student's obligation

Students are required to read the assigned materials at home, understand it, discuss it with their peers in the groups, relate it to their world and present it in the class. They are responsible for their activities and progress. All the assignments should be delivered **on time**.
