

Linkers are words that relate one idea or sentence of the text with another.

e.g.,

It was raining, so I stayed at home. It was raining. Therefore, I stayed at home.

1. And

.....is a linker of addition to sum one concept, idea, phrase or sentence to another:

a) A, B and C.

b) I like jazz, coffee **and** social interaction.

2. But

.....is a linker of contrast to show contrasting or contradictory concepts, ideas, phrases or sentences:

a) That car is fantastic **but** it's expensive.

b) I like all kinds of dogs, but bulldogs.

3. Or

.....is a conjunction that connects two or more possibilities or alternatives.

e.g.

 You can have some freshly baked scones or some chocolate cake or both.

4. So

...... The linkers *so, because* and *therefore* show a relationship of **reason and result**, or **cause and effect**.

e.g.

- It was raining, so I stayed at home.
- I stayed at home because it was raining.
