# Course description:

An introduction to the process, logic and skills of social science research inquiry. The course discusses issues such as: what is scientific social research; how does it differ from other ways of viewing and representing social world; how empirical research interacts with social theory and existing knowledge; why are we talking about methodological pluralism in social sciences; what are the basic principles in social research and on what ontological and epistemological assumptions are they based; what are the methodological implications of choosing one or the other of the research approaches. Ethics and politics in social research as well as the criteria for assessing the quality of social research will be also discussed.

#### **Course Objectives:**

This course is designed to achieve the followings:

- 1. Understand how social scientists generate our knowledge about the social world, and why we do it the ways we do.
- Know how to use a variety of tools and approaches to assist in your (or others') research. 2.
- 3. Being able to recognize and differentiate between the nature of qualitative and quantitative researches.
- Gain insight into systematic literature review in social science researches. 4.
- Develop your own empirical research question(s) and ability to find answers. 5.
- Being familiar with Ethics and politics in social research. 6

Upon completion of this course, students will be able to:

- 1. Demonstrate their comprehension of knowledge production process.
- Identify the major paradigms, concepts, and methods in social research and recognize the 2. relations between theory and research.
- 3. Demonstrate an understanding of the nature of quantitative and quantitative methods.
- 4. Generate research questions and identify the techniques that help them to find answers
- 5. Conduct systematic literature review.
- Recognize the ethical principles of conducting research. 6.

#### **Teaching Methods**

Lecture, group discussions, student presentation, individual work, and selected readings.
