The program consists of many parts Guided Reading This section provides guidance and practice in strategies for efficient reading. 1- BEFORE YOU READ - Here students are guided to think about the subject, predict content and then to skim the text in order to get a general impression.

2- WHILE YOU READ - These tasks guide the students to read with a purpose in mind.

3- AFTER YOU READ - This section is divided into two parts:

• How much did you understand? - These are simple comprehension questions, whose purpose is to show students how much they have understood and to build their confidence.

• Text Analysis - Here students are asked to answer text analysis questions that require thinking about the writer's purpose and point of view, as well as organization of the text.
