Strategies for Better Teaching and More Student Engagement



1. Teachers should start the lesson by asking a question related to the previous lesson (warm-up activity)


Examples:

If the previous lesson was about <u>animals</u>, you can ask students a question such as:


- Guess its name! it is a very big animal with big ears. Or
- What type of animal has no legs but can move very fast?

2. Teachers should start the new topic with eliciting techniques. (lead-in activities)


Such activities usually help students get a clear idea of what they are going to learn

3. Then, teachers should start the new topic (T) from the **presentation** stage.

4. They should also let students have sufficient practice after the presentation stage (T-Ss)

- 5. Teachers should finalize the topic with **production** stage (Ss)
- 6. Another strategy is to involve students in competitive tasks to better engage them.
- 7. Teachers should also give students homework
