Futurist architecture is an early-20th century form of architecture born in Italy, characterized by anti-historicism, strong chromaticism, long dynamic lines, suggesting speed, motion and urgency:

First it was an artistic movement founded by the poet Filippo Tommaso Marinetti.

The Art Deco style of architecture
with its streamlined forms was
regarded as futuristic when it was
in style in the 1920s and 1930s.
The original name for both early
and late Art Deco was
Art Moderne--the name
"Art Deco" did not come into use
until 1968 when the term was
invented in a book by Bevis Hillier.

The Chrysler Building is a notable example of Art Decofuturist architecture.
